Design Competition Guidelines:

Introduction

In today's economy many are finding it necessary to work from home or start a home based business, but may lack the space and/or privacy necessary for a home office. The | **shed** | provides a solution for live/work entrepreneurs in a down economy.

This competition is for a prototype design intended for use in a typical residential application in Jacksonville, Florida or surrounding areas.

Outline

For this competition, the entrant is asked to design an office shed, separate from a primary residence on a typical residential lot, 100' x 50'. Entrants are encouraged to be creative in considering the following requirements:

- The shed must be free standing and must not be connected in any way physically with another structure.
- The shed must be completely sustainable and off grid for power and water. No city services will be provided.
- The shed should have its own access to the street or a sidewalk independent of the residence.
- Entrants are limited to 200 square feet in area and 14'-0" in total building height. Entrants must provide a **minimum** of one work area with storage and a small conference/work space with seating for four. All spacial uses must be clearly demonstrated on the presentation documents. A raised foundation system should be used to minimize the need for footings and maximize ease of construction and placement on site.
- A template site plan is available for download on the AIA Jacksonville website and should be used as the basis of design for this competition.

Number of entries

Entrants may enter as many times as they would like as long as all the rules of the competition are met.

Rules

1. The competition is open to all emerging design professional (EDP) members, associate AIA members, intern architects and licensed practicing architects in the first 10 years of practice within the state of Florida.
2. Entrants must register for each entry they plan to submit via the [AIA Jacksonville website](#). There is a \$25.00 registration fee that must be paid online at the time of registration and is non-refundable. Once registration is complete, a registration number will be assigned to each entrant via email. This number should be used for all competition correspondence and submissions.
3. Presentation boards should be **24" X 36" Portrait**, in JPEG format at a minimum of 300 dpi. A **maximum of two (2) Boards** are allowed for each entry. One board should include a brief description of design intent and sustainable technologies used.
4. Presentation boards should include at least **one site plan at 1:20 scale, one floor plan at 1/2" scale, a minimum of one interior and one exterior rendering**. Additional drawings should be included as necessary, and at the entrants discretion, to adequately convey overall design intent.
5. Entrants will submit their work digitally via FTP site. The entrants' registration number must be used as the file name for submissions. No other identification should be used.
6. Deadline for entries is **May 17, 2010 at 5:00 pm EST**. Electronic presentation boards must be submitted to the AIA Jacksonville FTP site prior to deadline. No submittals will be accepted after the 5:00 pm deadline.
7. Winners will be selected based upon overall quality of the **design**, use of **sustainable materials and technology**, viability of construction and overall **design creativity**.
8. First Prize: \$750
Second Prize: \$500
Third Prize: \$250
Fourth Prize: Honorable Mention
Fifth Prize: Honorable Mention
